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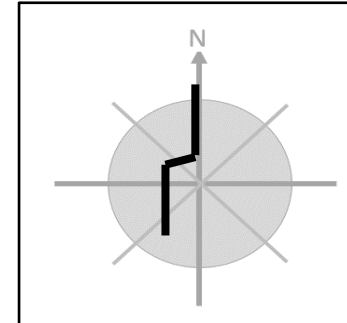

Southern section stands on revetment 1m high within the washfold. It bends round above the chamber towards the beck. Above is the fell wall with a hog hole leading through to another fold on the far side of the wall. Chamber heavily infested with bracken. Further washfold chambers to north but standard drystone walls only.
