

MILLOM,

BOOTLE, CORNEY, HAVERIGG, KIRKSANTON, MIDDLETON PLACE, SILECROFT, THWAITES, UNDERHILL, WHICHAM, AND WHITBECK.

MILLOM is a township and parish, the latter comprising the chapelries of THWAITES and ULPRIA, and the townships of BINKER-WITH-AUSTHWAITE, CHAPEL SUCKEN and LOWER and UPPER MILLOM. A market hall has been erected in Market square, and a club and institute in St. George's road. The principal support of the district is derived from iron ore mines in the neighbourhood, now worked by THE HODBARROW MINING COMPANY, the WHICHAM MINING COMPANY, LIMITED, and the CUMBERLAND IRON MINING AND SMELTING COMPANY, LIMITED. The parish is bounded on the west and south by the Irish Sea, and on the east by the river Duddon. The latter forms a bay, abounding with cockles, mussels, salmon, and eels. The parish church of HOLY TRINITY is an ancient structure; the living is a discharged vicarage, in the gift of the Crown. The parish contained in 1871, 4,761, and in 1881, 8,099 inhabitants.

BOOTLE is a small market town and parish, in the ward of Allerdale-above-Derwent, 5½ miles s.s.e. from Ravenglass, very pleasantly situated about two miles from the Irish Sea, and environed by pleasing scenery, the land being in a high state of cultivation. The Furness Railway passes about a mile from the village. The eminences of the Fells in the adjacent forest of Copeland afford extensive views, and from Black Combe, which is nearly two thousand feet high, may be seen the coast of Ireland, the coast of Scotland, the Isle of Man, and the Welsh mountains. Bootle is a polling station at the election of members for the western division of the county. It is said by the inhabitants to be the smallest market town in England. The parish church of Saint Michael is one of early erection, but alterations at various periods have de-

prived it of its original character. A new tower was erected in 1853. The church contains some interesting monuments, and an octagonal font of black marble. The living is a rectory, in the patronage of the Earl of Lonsdale. The Independents have a place of worship. A Grammar school was founded here in 1713, by a Mr. Henry Singleton, for teaching six boys gratuitously; and in 1830, Captain Shaw, R.N. munificently established a public school, which is now conducted upon the National plan. The market is held on Saturday, and the fairs September 24th and April 26th, for sheep and cattle. The parish of Bootle contained in 1871, 795, and in 1881, 810 inhabitants.

CORNEY, otherwise CORNHOW or CORNO, is a small parish, three miles in length and two in breadth, containing several scattered houses, and the hamlet of MIDDLETON PLACE, 2½ miles n. by e. from Bootle, and 4 miles s.s.e. of Ravenglass. There is a deep ravine on the Corney Hall estate, called Black Dub Gill, where the rocks rise one above another in majestic form, clothed with wood of every hue, while the deep sound of the Annes, which flows through the romantic glen, adds not a little to the general interest. Population in 1871, 226, and in 1881, 210.

WHICHAM, or WHICHAM CHAPEL, is a small parish, strictly agricultural, containing the village of SILECROFT, 4 miles s. of Bootle. Population in 1871, 349, and in 1881, 374.

WHITBECK, extending 3 miles along the coast, and 2½ miles inland is a small parish about 1 mile s. of Bootle. The church is dedicated to Saint Mary. Population in 1871, 183, and in 1881, 181.
