BROUGHTON-IN-FURNESS.

*Angerton, Beckside, Chappels, Crossbeck, Dunnerdale, Foxfield, Gillbeck,
Grizebeck, Heathwaite, Kirkby Ireleth, Sandside, Seathwaite,
Soutergate, and Woodland.*

BROUGHTON-IN-FURNESS, or WEST BROUGHTON, is a small market town and chapelry, in the parish of Kirkby Ireleth and hundred of Lonsdale, north of the Sands, 270 miles n.w. by n. from London, 30 n.w. from Lancaster, 85 n.w. from Manchester, and 10 n.w. from Ulverston. The town is healthfully and pleasantly situated, about half a mile from the river Duddon, which is navigable within the like distance of the bridge; and on the declivity of a gentle eminence, with a south aspect; it is a station on the Coniston branch of the Furness line, and at FOXFIELD there is a junction of the Whitehaven and Furness railway. The town consists of a square and four principal streets, and the houses, which are chiefly built of stone and covered with slate, have a clean and respectable appearance. The introduction of machinery has superseded hand spinning of woollen yarn, which was formerly a source of profit to many of the inhabitants. The vicinity abounds in woods, consisting chiefly of ash, oak, and elder, which are cut down periodically, and converted into hoops and brush stocks, large quantities of which are sent from here annually. John Sawrey, Esq., who is lord of the manor, and presents to the living of Broughton, holds a court baron at the King's Head, annually, in the month of April. The church of Broughton is an ancient structure, and is dedicated to St. Mary Magdalene; the living, a perpetual curacy, value £130 per annum, is in the gift of John Sawrey, Esq., J.P. Two public schools are in the chapelry. The surrounding country, which is mountainous, abounds with slate, and the minerals peculiar to the Furness Fells. The air is salubrious, and the inhabitants famed for their longevity, in evidence of which it appears by the register that four centenarians have been buried at Broughton since 1791, two of whom were 104 years of age. Eleven per cent of the inhabitants live over 30. Fairs are held on the 27th of April, hiring; August 1st, cattle and sheep; October 6th, cattle and sheep; and the 1st Wednesday after the 11th November, hiring and wool. There is also a cattle market held on the first Wednesday in each month, excepting the months when the annual fairs are held. The acreage of the chapelry is 5,710. The population of West Broughton was in 1871, 1,082, and in 1881, 1,171.

KIRKBY IRELETH is an extensive parish, in Ulverston poor law union and hundred of Lonsdale, north of the sands. The parish comprises the townships of KIRKBY IRELETH, BROUGHTON WEST, and DUNNERDALE with SEATHWAITE, and is also divided for parochial purposes into four districts—HEATHWAITE, WOODLAND, LOW QUARTER and MIDDLE QUARTER, which contain the small hamlets and villages of BECKSIDE, GRIZEBECK, HEATHWAITE, FOXFIELD, CHAPPELS, CROSSBECK, GILLEBECK, SANDSIDE, and SOUTERGATE. The village of Kirkby is situate about 5 miles n.w. by w. from Ulverston, and 4 from Broughton. In the neighbourhood are extensive quarries of a dark blue slate, of excellent quality, now worked by the Duke of Devonshire. Kirkby is also a station on the Furness line. The church situated at Beckside, is dedicated to St. Cuthbert, and is an ancient stone building, supposed to have been founded by Alexander de Kirby, who, in the reign of Henry III., conveyed it, with forty acres of land, to the Abbey of Furness. It contains several ancient monuments, and its windows exhibit some beautiful specimens of stained glass. The living is a discharged vicarage, annual value £143, in the gift of the dean and Chapter of York. There is also a very good elementary school at Beckside, named

the Burlington, erected by the Duke of Devonshire; the building, which is a handsome and commodious one, has accommodation for 250 scholars. A small school under the School Board has also been built at Grizebeck, to accommodate sixty scholars. The other villages are unimportant, and very small places. Acreage of parish, 25,740; of the township of Kirkby-Ireleth, 9,010. The population of the township in 1871, was 1,763, and in 1881, 1,722.

SEATHWAITE is a chapelry, or ecclesiastical parish, but for other purposes forms a joint township with Dunnerdale. Seathwaite is 7 miles and Dunnerdale 3 miles *s.* from Broughton. The scenery in this neighbourhood, and the sequestered vale of Duddon is enchanting, and furnished a theme for the poet Wordsworth's verse. The chapel in Seathwaite is a small stone building; the living is a curacy, of the annual value of £160, in the gift of the representatives of W. S. Rawlinson, Esq. This village also contains a parochial school. Acreage of Seathwaite, 7,000; of Dunnerdale, 3,910. Population of the joint township in 1881, 299. Letters through Broughton-in-Furness.

WOODLAND is a chapelry, and one of the divisions of Kirkby Ireleth parish, containing a station on the Coniston branch of the Furness line. The chapel is a small building; the living, a perpetual curacy, of the annual value of £140, is in the gift of the landowners.

ANGERTON, or ANGERTON MOSS, is a small township and parish, and is situated 2 miles *s.* of Broughton, and adjoins Kirkby Ireleth.
