

Vic. c. 75) was adopted by the town 5th March, 1875, but under the provisions of the Act of 1894 (56 and 57 Vic. c. 75) the town is now governed by an Urban District Council of 15 members, and is divided into 2 wards. The town is well laid out, lighted with gas from works in Millom road, and has a good supply of water from works at Blystone Bank, Whitham, both works being the property of the Urban District Council. Under the provisions of the above-named Act, Millom Urban District has been formed into a civil parish, known as Millom Urban.

The ecclesiastical parish of St. George was formed out of the old parish of Millom, March 4th, 1879. The church, erected during the period 1774-77, at a total cost of £13,465, is an edifice of native red sandstone with freestone dressings, in the Gothic style, and consists of chancel, nave of five bays, north aisle, north porch and an eastern embattled tower with spire; a peal of six bells was installed in 1920 as a memorial to the men of this parish who fell in the Great War; there are 600 sittings. The register dates from the year 1877. The living is a vicarage, with Haverigg annexed, net yearly value £375, with residence, in the gift of five trustees, and held since 1902 by the Rev. Frank Pascoe. St. Luke's church at HAVERIGG, a chapel of ease to St. George's, erected in 1871, at a cost of £1,522, is a building of blue slatestone, with red sandstone dressings, in the Early English style, and consists of chancel, nave, north porch and a bell gable with one bell; the church will seat 200. The Rev. George Wilfred Arnold B.A. of Queens' College, Cambridge, has been curate in charge since 1915. The foundation stone of a mission hall, in connection with St. George's, was laid 23 September, 1896, by Archdeacon Sinclair, on a site given by the Earl of Lonsdale. The Catholic church, in Queen street, dedicated to Our Lady and St. James, and erected in 1888, at a cost of £1,450, is an edifice of brick and stone with freestone dressings, in the Early English style, and has about 550 sittings. The Wesleyan chapel, also in Queen street, erected in 1875, at a cost of £2,865, is a substantial building of local stone, dressed with freestone, and will seat 400. The United Methodist chapel, in Newton street, erected in 1871, at a cost of about £1,200, is a building of stone, seating about 400, and there is another at Haverigg, erected in 1875, at a cost of about £100, with 200 sittings. The Primitive Methodist chapel, in Holborn hill, erected in 1870, and partly rebuilt in 1907 at a cost of about £100, will seat 200, and is at Haverigg, erected in 1877, at a cost of about £1,200, seats 400. The Baptist chapel, in Crown street, erected in 1884, affords 220 sittings. The Welsh Calvinistic Methodist hold their services in the Temperance Hall, Maingate road, which seats 300. The Salvation Army fortress, in Nelson street, is a structure of brick, erected in 1889, at a cost of £640, and will seat 600. The Spiritualists have a meeting house in Holborn hill. The Hedderrow Mining Co. Limited work

an extensive deposit of hematite iron ore, situated here, on the estuary of the river Duddon. The ore, which is of the richest quality, lies partly under the foreshore of the estuary, and the company have constructed a sea wall and embankment, at a cost of upwards of £100,000, in order to exclude the sea from that portion of the shore under which the ore is lying; another embankment was completed in 1905 at a cost of £600,000. There is a private hospital attached to the mines. The company employ about 1,100 hands, and raise about half a million tons of ore annually. The works of this company, and the extensive iron works of the Millom and Ashham Hematite Iron Co. Limited, employing about 600 hands, are the chief causes of the continued prosperity of the town. The Market Hall and Urban District Council Offices, at the entrance to the town, erected in 1879, at a cost of £3,500, are of stone and include a tower with clock. The County Hall, Market square, seats about 900. The Central Hall, in Holborn hill, will seat about 600; Mrs. Eleanor Gendle, proprietress. The Co-operative Buildings, consisting of several shops and a large hall above holding 800 people, were erected in 1888, at a cost of £5,255. The Market day is on Saturday. The Free Public Library is a structure of brick, in the so-called "Queen Anne" style; it was originally built for a Working Men's Institute, but was purchased in 1891 by the late Local Board, at a cost of £1,000, and devoted to its present purpose; it has since been enlarged, and now consists of a reading room and lending library and reference library containing 1,000 volumes, and three art class rooms; the library contains about 10,000 volumes, and issues 50,000 volumes annually. The Millom Detachment (D Company) of the 4th Battalion The King's Own (Royal Lancaster Regiment) has a drill hall in Holborn hill and a rifle range at Haverigg Haws; the hall is also used for public assemblies, and will hold about 400 people. The Volunteer Fire Brigade station is at the Market Hall. Millom and Bootle Joint Infectious Diseases Hospital was erected in 1905 at a cost of £2,200, and has 15 beds, and in 1914 an extension was built at a cost of about £1,200, and provides an additional 16 beds. The area of the civil parish and Urban District is 1,455 acres of land and 8 of inland and 180 of tidal water and 857 of foreshore; valuable value, £17,719; population in 1901, 10,026 and in 1911, 8,612, and 6,440 in the ecclesiastical parish of St. George in 1911.

The population of the wards in 1911 was:—Haverigg, 2,119; Holborn Hill, 1,724; Newtown North, 2,925; Newtown South, 1,844.

HAVERIGG is a village of considerable size, about one mile south-west of the town, and forms a ward within the Urban District of Millom.
